Due to work obligations, I am unable to leave my job during business hours. However, my operator, Todd Crane, is here in the audience on my behalf and available to answer any questions you may have.</p> <p>The reason I am before you today is to appeal what I believe is an unfair denial of my Commercial Short-Term Rental (CSTR) permit renewal. My experience has been marked by confusion, lack of communication, and inconsistent processes from the Short-Term Rental (STR) office.</p> <p>When renewals were removed from the One Stop Website—without clear explanation—it created immediate uncertainty about how to renew permits. At the same time, the STR office was dealing with residential permits through a lottery system, which only added to the confusion.</p> <p>When I attempted to renew, I was instructed to email a copy of my previous renewal form (ironically, a form that had been removed from the website) to the STR office. I did this for one of my properties, but I never received any acknowledgment or response. I left multiple phone messages, but no one ever called me back to provide clarity or guidance.</p> <p>This silence led me to believe the process was incorrect or incomplete. As a result, I did not submit renewal</p> |
