AN ORDINANCE providing an Operating Budget of Revenues for the City of New Orleans for the Year 2026 in accordance with Sections 3-116, 4-206(1)(f), and 6-102 of the Home Rule Charter of the City of New Orleans; and otherwise to provide with respect thereto.
