A RESOLUTION calling an election in the Lake Willow Subdivision Improvement District for November 3, 2026.

WHEREAS, the Louisiana State Legislature enacted La. R.S. 33:9073, creating the Lake Willow Subdivision Improvement District (“District”) and authorizing the City Council to levy and collect a flat annual fee not to exceed \$300 on each parcel located within the District, for a term not to exceed eight years, when authorized by the District and approved by the majority of the District’s registered voters; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the District met on April 18, 2026, and adopted a resolution requesting the City Council to levy an annual \$300 parcel fee, for three years, commencing on January 1, 2027 and ending December 31, 2029, subject to the majority approval of the District’s registered voters at the November 3, 2026 election; **NOW, THEREFORE**

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEW ORLEANS, That

SECTION 1. Election Call. Subject to the approval of the State Bond Commission and under the authority conferred by La. R.S. 33:9073 and the Louisiana Election Code, an election is hereby called for Saturday, November 3, 2026 between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. and at said election the electorate of the Lake Willow Subdivision Improvement District (“District”), comprised of the area of Orleans Parish located between Morrison Road on the north, the Lawrence Drainage Canal on the west, the I-10 Service Road on the south, and on the east by a line approximately two hundred feet west of the west line of Crowder Road, excluding Lots 1B, 1C, and 1D shown on the

District’s subdivision plan registered in COB692, folio202, Orleans Parish, may approve or disapprove the levy of an annual flat fee on each parcel located within the District in the amount of \$300, for three years, beginning January 1, 2027 through December 31, 2029, which is estimated to generate \$51,400 annually. Any fee levied upon a parcel in the District shall be in addition to any ad valorem tax affecting real property, or any charge (including, but not limited to, a sanitation charge), fee, license, permit or rate imposed or levied pursuant to the regulatory authority of the City of New Orleans in the operation of the city, its departments, agencies, boards and commissions, whether attached or unattached, including, but not limited to, the Sewerage and Water Board. The proceeds of any fee collected shall be used exclusively for the purpose of promoting and encouraging the beautification, security, and overall betterment of the District; however, the City of New Orleans may retain one percent of the amount collected as a collection fee. The affairs of the District are managed by the Board of Commissioners (“Board”) which shall adopt an annual budget in accordance with the Local Government Budget Act, La. R.S. 39:1301, et seq. The members of the Board serve without compensation.

The official ballot used in the voting machines for the election shall be as follows:

Shall the City of New Orleans levy a flat annual fee on each parcel located within the Lake Willow Subdivision Improvement District (“District”), as delineated by La. R.S. 33:9073(B), in the amount of \$300, for three years, beginning January 1, 2027 and ending December 31, 2029, which is estimated to generate \$51,400 annually, to be used exclusively for the purpose of promoting and encouraging the beautification, security, and overall betterment of the District, except for a 1% City collection fee, and provided that, if used to fund additional law enforcement or security personnel and services, such personnel and services shall be supplemental to and not in lieu of those provided by the New Orleans Police Department?

SECTION 2. District Boundaries. The boundaries of the District are the area of Orleans Parish located between Morrison Road on the north, the Lawrence Drainage Canal on the west, the I-10 Service Road on the south, and on the east by a line approximately two hundred feet west of the west line of Crowder Road, excluding Lots 1B, 1C, and 1D shown on the District's subdivision plan registered in COB692, folio202, Orleans Parish.

SECTION 3. Publication of Notice of Election. Notice of this election shall be published in the City of New Orleans' official journal once a week for four consecutive weeks, with the first publication occurring between 45 and 90 days prior to the election date, as provided in Exhibit "A". Exhibit "A" is hereby incorporated as if the same were set forth in full.

SECTION 4. Canvass. The City Council, acting under the powers granted to it by the Home Rule Charter of the City of New Orleans and state statutes, shall meet, in open session, in the Council Chamber, City Hall, 1300 Perdido Street, New Orleans, Louisiana on Thursday, December 17, 2026, beginning at 10:00 a.m. to examine and canvass the returns and declare the election result.

SECTION 5. Polling Places. The polling places set forth in the aforesaid notice of election are hereby designated as the polling places at which to hold the said election, and the commissioners-in-charge and commissioners will be the same persons as those designated in accordance with law.

SECTION 6. Election Commissioners; Voting Machines. The officers designated to serve as commissioners-in-charge and commissioners pursuant to Section 5 hereof, or such substitutes therefor, as may be selected and designated in accordance with La. R.S. 18:1287, shall hold the said election as herein provided, and shall make due returns of said election to the City Council. All registered voters in the District are entitled to vote at said election and voting machines shall be used thereat.

SECTION 7. Authorization of Officers. The Clerk of Criminal District Court is hereby empowered, authorized and directed to arrange for and to furnish to said election officers in ample time for the holding of said election, the necessary equipment, forms and other paraphernalia essential to

the proper holding of said election and the President and Clerk of the City Council and the City Attorney are authorized, empowered and directed to take any and all further action required by state and/or federal law to arrange for the election.

SECTION 8. Furnishing Election Call to Election Officials. Certified copies of this resolution shall be forwarded to the Secretary of State, the Clerk of Court and ex-officio parish custodian of voting machines in and for the Parish of Orleans, State of Louisiana, and the Registrar of Voters in and for said parish, as notification of the election herein called, in order that each may prepare for said election and perform their respective functions as required by law.

SECTION 9. Application to State Bond Commission. Application is made to the State Bond Commission for consent and authority to hold the aforesaid election as herein provided, and in the event said election results in approval of the proposition, for further consent and authority to levy and collect the special fee provided for therein, and a certified copy of this resolution shall be forwarded to the State Bond Commission on behalf of the City Council requesting prompt consideration and approval of the application.

The following proposition will be submitted to all registered voters (who are qualified and entitled to vote at this election in accordance with all state and federal laws) residing in the Lake Willow Subdivision Improvement District (“District”), which is comprised of the area of Orleans Parish located between Morrison Road on the north, the Lawrence Drainage Canal on the west, the I-10 Service Road on the south, and on the east by a line approximately two hundred feet west of the west line of Crowder Road, excluding Lots 1B, 1C, and 1D shown on the District’s subdivision plan registered in COB692, folio202, Orleans Parish:
